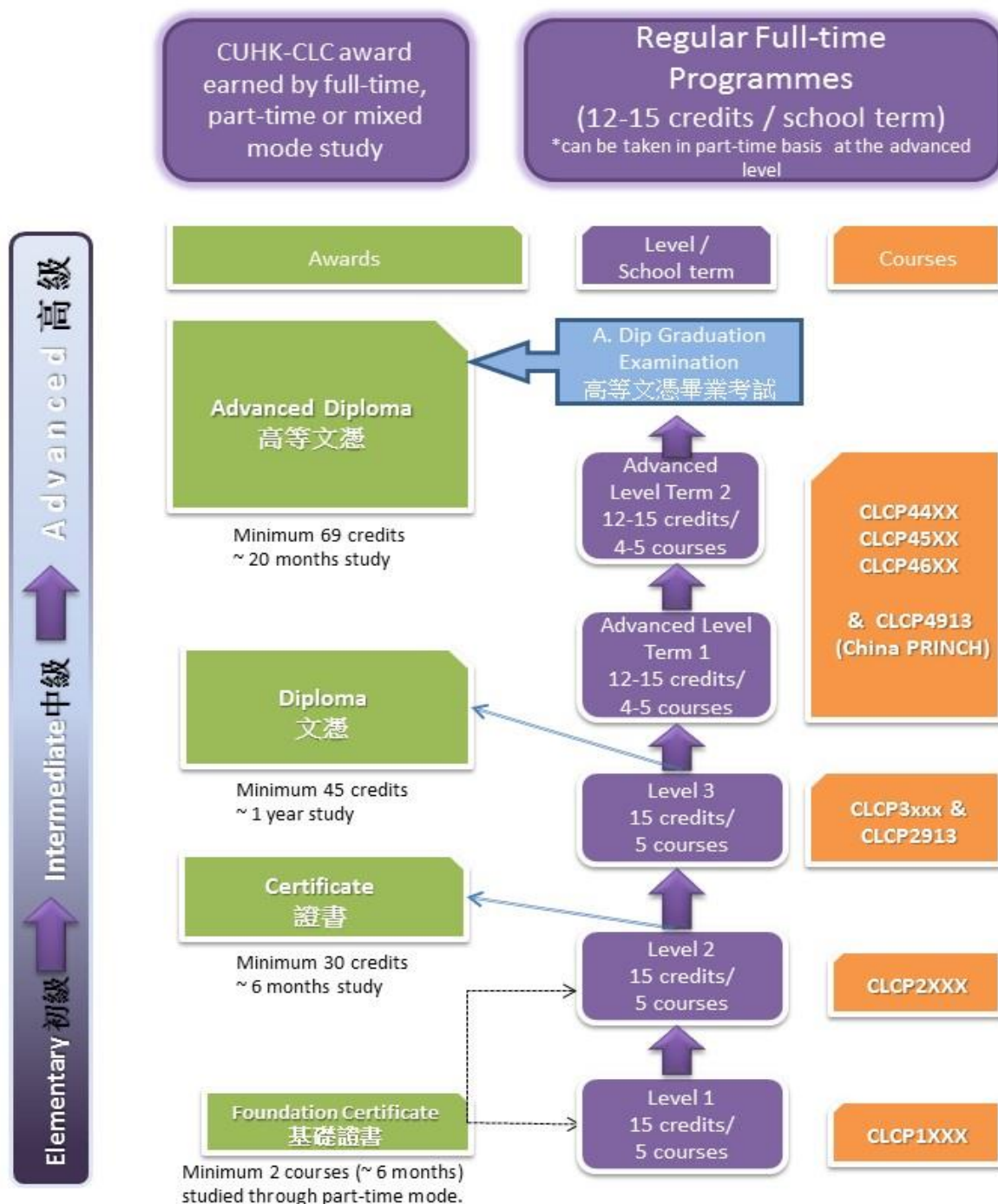

## Level 1

*An intensive programme for beginning students of Putonghua which lays a foundation for further studies focusing on the Chinese language, with emphasis on oral proficiency and aural comprehension. Students will be exposed to over 800 basic Putonghua terms based on approximately 400 Chinese characters. Coursework will include some written exercises to help consolidate speaking ability.*

***A minimum of 15 credits (5 courses) per school term are required for this level and for student visa sponsorship (if applicable).***

*The course code prefix of CLCP below was formerly known as CPTH.*

### **\*^CLCP1113**

#### **Application of Vocabulary & Grammar I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An elementary course designed to familiarize students with the use of basic vocabulary and grammar points. Vocabulary introduced based on everyday conversations and daily usage. Focus will be on appropriateness in application.

### **\*^CLCP1123**

#### **Oral Skills Practice I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An elementary course focused on students' fluency in communication with basic vocabulary and grammar points through various kinds of speaking practice. Real life settings are introduced such as shopping, introducing family members, asking directions etc.

### **\*^CLCP1133**

#### **Communication in context I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An elementary course designed to familiarize students with basic vocabulary and grammar points through language tasks/activities and contextualized exercises. Real life settings are introduced such as shopping, introducing family members, asking directions etc.

### **\*^CLCP1143**

#### **Listening & Reading Comprehension Skills I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This elementary course focused on building up students' listening ability in real life context. Everyday settings are introduced such as shopping, introducing family members, asking directions etc.

### **\*^CLCP1153**

#### **Basic Presentation Skills & Daily Situations I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This elementary course helps students to build up abilities in presenting basic ideas in real life communication settings. Tasks like picture description, speaking topics and simple presentation will be adopted to train students in presentation with various everyday settings.

### **#CLCP1163**

#### **Special Topics for Elementary Learners**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This elementary course is designed to consolidate learners' language skills with special topics as determined by the teachers subject to the class's need. Topics can include but not limited to training associated to the national Chinese test (HSK) level 1 to 2; COPA intermediate level simple communicative tasks such as introducing (informal), leaving messages, making appointments, shopping, ordering food, describing simple events; elementary business Chinese training etc.

## Level 2

*An intensive course for students who have completed PTH level one or with equivalent competence in Putonghua, emphasizing oral skills and listening comprehension, with more exposure to basic structural points. Students will be exposed to more elementary and intermediate terms and expressions in Putonghua based on approximately 300 additional Chinese characters. Coursework will include some written exercises to help consolidate speaking ability.*

***A minimum of 15 credits (5 courses) per school term are required for this level and for student visa sponsorship (if applicable).***

*The course code prefix of CLCP below was formerly known as CPTH.*

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### **\*CLCP2213**

#### **Application of Vocabulary & Grammar II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An intermediate course designed to familiarize students with the use of more vocabulary and grammar points. Vocabulary introduced based on everyday conversations and daily usage. Focus will be on appropriateness in application.

### **\*CLCP2223**

#### **Oral Skills Practice II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An intermediate course focused on students' fluency in speaking practice in real life settings, such as going to the airport, attending a wedding party, going to see movies, discussing travel plans, talking about hobbies etc.

### **\*CLCP2233**

#### **Communication in Context II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An intermediate course designed to familiarize students with newly acquired vocabulary and grammar points through language tasks/activities and contextualized exercises in real life settings.

### **\*CLCP2243**

#### **Listening & Reading Comprehension Skills II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An intermediate course focused on building up students' listening ability. Real life settings are introduced such as going to the airport, attending a wedding party, going to see movies, discussing travel plans, talking about hobbies etc.

### **\*CLCP2253**

#### **Basic Presentation Skills & Daily Situations II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An intermediate course to help students improve their proficiency to communicate in authentic situations by integrating the newly acquired vocabulary items and grammar structures.

### **#CLCP2263 Special Topics for Intermediate Learners**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This intermediate course is designed to consolidate learners' language skills with special topics as determined by the teachers subject to the class's need. Topics can include but not limited to training associated to the national Chinese test (HSK) level 2 to 3; COPA intermediate level communicative tasks such as showing direction, describing past events, comparing, expressing thanks, explaining, discussing; intermediate business Chinese training etc.

### **# CLCP2913A/B/C Pragmatic Internship in China (PRINCH, Intermediate level)A/B/C**

3 credits; summer term only

This is a compulsory course for Advanced Diploma students and an elective course to students targeting other level award which is usually offered in the Summer Term.

“PRINCH” allows intermediate and advanced Putonghua learners to practice what they have learned in class through a variety of activities in the target culture, an approach that has been recognized by professionals and highly recommended as a most effective means to cultivate pragmatic competence of language learners. Students will be assigned to small groups led by trained teaching assistants to explore different themes by visit. Themes may include arts and culture, history and traditions, government & policies, contemporary and folk culture etc. Students are expected to prepare and give oral presentation related to the visit which will then be assessed by the teaching assistants and/ or the lecturer.

PRINCH will be held in a selected mainland China city during the term break between Spring and Summer. The format will be a very intensive language and culture immersion which lasts for 7 to 14 consecutive days. Former destination includes Guangzhou, Beijing and Xi'an.

Note: PRINCH is a compulsory "capstone" course for Advanced Diploma programme. If students with some strong reasons want to excuse from taking PRINCH must forward written justification to the Division Head, and in replacement, to take 3 more electives to fulfill the graduation requirement. The former course code for intermediate level and advanced level Putonghua PRINCH was CPTH3363 and CPTH4713 respectively. ### Level 3

*An intensive course for students who have completed level two or with equivalent competence in Putonghua. This course is designed to improve students' language skills through reading and discussion of many aspects of Chinese society with emphasis on communicative ability. Students will be exposed to a wide range of terms and expressions based on approximately 200 additional Chinese characters. Coursework will include some written exercises to help consolidate speaking ability.*

*A minimum of 15 credits (5 courses) per school term are required for this level and for student visa sponsorship (if applicable).*

*The course code prefix of CLCP below was formerly known as CPTH.*

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**\*CLCP3313 Application of Vocabulary & Grammar III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An upper intermediate course designed to familiarize students with the use of newly acquired vocabulary and grammar points. Focus will be on appropriateness in application. Real life settings are introduced such as buying a computer, going to the doctor, renting a flat, moving to a new home etc.

**\*CLCP3323 Oral Skills Practice III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An upper intermediate course focused on students' fluency in speaking practice with newly acquired vocabulary and grammar points. Real life settings are introduced such as buying a computer, going to the doctor, renting a flat, moving to a new home etc.

**\*CLCP3333 Communication in Context III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An upper intermediate course designed to familiarize students with newly acquired vocabulary and grammar points through language tasks/activities and contextualized exercises. Real life settings are introduced such as buying a computer, going to the doctor, renting a flat, moving to a new home etc.

**\*# CLCP3343 Listening & Reading Comprehension Skills III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An upper intermediate course focused on building up students' listening ability. Real life settings are introduced such as buying a computer, going to the doctor, renting a flat, moving to a new home etc.

**\* CLCP3353 Basic Presentation Skills & Daily Situations III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

A higher intermediate course helping students to further improve their proficiency to communicate in a variety of authentic situations by integrating the newly acquired vocabulary items and grammar structures.

**\*# CLCP3363 Special Topics for Upper Intermediate Learners** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This upper intermediate course is designed to consolidate learners' language skills with special topics as determined by the teachers subject to the class's need. Topics can include but not limited to training associated to the national Chinese test (HSK) level 3 to 4; COPA advanced level tasks such as complaining, refusing, apologizing, criticizing, analyzing, suggesting, explaining, stating a fact, promoting, introducing (semi-formal); intermediate business Chinese etc. (This course is to be first offered in Summer 2016)

**# CLCP2913A/B/C Pragmatic Internship in China (PRINCH, Intermediate level)A/B/C** 3 credits; summer term only

This is a compulsory course for Advanced Diploma students and an elective course to students

## Level 4 - the Advanced Level

*Level 4 marks the start of the advanced level. Different from the elementary and intermediate levels, in the advanced level, students are expected to take an active role in the learning by preparing lessons more intensively before the lessons; to nurture appropriateness in the use of a language, and to develop how-to-learn skill for life-long learning.*

*During the first school term of the advanced level, the programme follows a proficiency-oriented, task-based approach focusing on communication ability in speaking and covering other major skills in listening, reading and writing, especially in areas that are closely related to speaking, such as communication in professional situations and advanced communication skills.*

*In the second school term of the advanced level, the programme follows a proficiency-oriented, task-based approach focusing on communication ability in speaking and covering other major skills in listening, reading and writing, especially in areas that are closely related to speaking, such as topical communication, professional communication skills and sector-specific training.*

*Student at the advanced level can enjoy a free combination of 3 credits (1 course) to 15 credits (5 courses). **A minimum of 12 credits per school term** are required for student visa sponsorship. **Please refer to the study scheme for advanced level students to learn about the course combination in each school term.***

*The course code prefix of CLCP below was formerly known as CPTH.*

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**CLCP4403 Advance Patterns & Presentation Skills I** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week  
This advanced course is designed to familiarize students with advanced patterns and variety of expressions focusing on the appropriateness in application in different situations. Content reference can be made to the COPA advanced and superior tasks, national Chinese oral test (HSKK) advanced level, and national Chinese test (HSK) level 4 to 5 curricula.

**CLCP4413 News Media & Presentation Skills I** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week  
An advanced course designed to familiarize students with journal articles, focusing on expansion of vocabulary through reading, discussion and presentation based on selected readings from Chinese newspapers.

**CLCP4423 Speech Preparation & Presentation Skills I** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week  
An advanced course designed for students who want to improve their expression proficiency through writing practices. Topics covered in other courses of the same level are used for practicing purposes in this course.

**CLCP4433 Advanced Topical Conversation I** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week  
An advanced course designed to enhance students' ability in communication on selected daily life topics such as clothing, food, work, vacation, illnesses, marriage, use of internet, life-style, etc.

**CLCP4443 Communication Skills on Business Topics I** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week  
An advanced course designed to familiarize students with a wide range of business and economy-related topics and terminology, focusing on topics related to Hong Kong and mainland China.

**CLCP4453 Communication Skills & Culture I** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week  
An advanced course designed to improve students' language skills in communication, as well as to increase their understanding of Chinese culture and society through selected readings.

**CLCP4463 Special Topics I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course tailor-made to provide special training focusing on specific aspects related to various professional fields.

**CLCP4473 TV Commercial I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to improve students' language skills in communication, as well as to increase their understanding of Chinese culture and society through watching and discussion of Chinese TV programs, including language used in commercial advertisements.

**CLCP4503 Advance Patterns & Presentation Skills II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This advanced course is designed to familiarize students with advanced patterns and variety of expressions focusing on the appropriateness in application in different situations. Content reference can be made to the COPA advanced and superior level tasks, national Chinese oral test (HSKK) advanced level, and national Chinese test (HSK) level 5 to 6 curricula.

**CLCP4513 News Media & Presentation Skills II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to familiarize students with language input from a wider variety of sources, such as TV programs and news broadcasts.

**CLCP4523 Speech Preparation & Presentation Skills II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course to improve students' speaking proficiency through writing practice. Topics covered in other courses of the same level/ school term are used for practicing purposes in this course.

**CLCP4533 Advanced Topical Conversation II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to enhance students' ability in communication on selected daily life topics related to social issues and current affairs, such as cuisine, fashion, terrorism, globalization, etc.

**CLCP4543 Communication Skills on Business Topics II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to familiarize students with a wide range of business and economy-related topics and terminology. Course materials include selected readings from Chinese newspapers.

**CLCP4553 Communication Skills & Culture II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to improve students' language skills in communication, as well as their understanding of Chinese culture and society through a wider variety of selected readings.

**CLCP4563 Special Topics II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

A course designed for different kinds of working professionals, such as businesspersons, bankers, financial consultants, education specialists, religious and social workers, etc. Sector specific trainings are designed to cater for advanced students' needs.

**CLCP4573 TV Commercial II**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course with a wide variety of input from TV commercials and programmes to strengthen the effective Chinese language communication and cultural understanding.

**CLCP4583 Chinese Literature**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course focusing on the analysis and discussion on selected literary works, including prose and poetry, to enhance students understanding of Chinese culture and history.

**CLCP4593 Fiction & Film I**

3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to enhance students' oral and aural proficiency through fiction & film, as well as to improve their understanding of Chinese culture and society through in-depth discussions based on movies.

**CLCP4603 Advance Patterns & Presentation Skills III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This advanced course is designed to familiarize students with advanced grammar and variety of expression patterns focusing on the appropriateness in application in different situations. Content reference can be made to the COPA advanced and superior tasks, national Chinese oral test (HSKK) advanced level, and national Chinese test (HSK) level 5 to 6 curricula.

**CLCP4613 News Media & Presentation Skills III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to build up students' confidence in discussing issues covered by journal articles, TV programs and news broadcasts.

**CLCP4623 Speech Preparation & Presentation Skills III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to build up students' confidence in speaking through writing practices. Topics covered in other courses of the same level are used for practicing purposes in this course.

**CLCP4633 Advanced Topical Conversation III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to enhance students' ability in communication on a wider variety of topics.

**CLCP4643 Communication Skills on Business Topics III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to familiarize students with a wider range of business and economy-related topics.

**CLCP4653 Communication Skills & Culture III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to build up students' confidence in communication related to social and cultural issues.

**CLCP4663 Special Topics III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

This course is designed for students intending to take the new HSK. It helps building students' capacity to work in a completely Chinese environment and/ or to pursue further study in mainland China university. Training includes Chinese listening, grammar, reading and speaking.

**CLCP4673 TV Commercial III** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course focusing on a deeper understanding & appreciation of Chinese culture through TV programs.

**CLCP4683 Classical Chinese for International Students** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course focusing on classical works only. General introductions to the format, style, vocabulary and grammar of classical Chinese will be covered.

**CLCP4693 Fiction & Film II** 3 credits; 3 hrs/week

An advanced course designed to enhance students' proficiency in reading, speaking & listening comprehension. Students are expected to improve their understanding of Chinese culture and society through selected readings from contemporary literary works, movies and in-depth discussions

**CLCP4913 A/B/C Pragmatic Internship in China (PRINCH, Advanced level)  
A/B/C** 3 credits; summer term only

This is a compulsory course for Advanced Diploma students and an elective course to students targeting other level award which is usually offered in the Summer Term.

“PRINCH” allows intermediate and advanced Putonghua learners to practice what they have learned in class through a variety of activities in the target culture, an approach that has been recognized by professionals and highly recommended as a most effective means to cultivate pragmatic competence of language learners. Students will be assigned to small groups led by trained teaching assistants to explore different themes by visit. Themes may include arts and culture, history and traditions, government & policies, contemporary and folk culture etc.

Chinese as a FSL (Putonghua/ Mandarin) curriculum, Yale-China Chinese Language Centre, CUHK  
Students are expected to prepare and give oral presentation related to the visit which will then be assessed by the teaching assistants and/ or the lecturer.

PRINCH will be held in a selected mainland China city during the term break between Spring and Summer. The format will be a very intensive language and culture immersion which lasts for 7 to 14 consecutive days. Former destination includes Guangzhou, Beijing and Xi'an.

Note: PRINCH is a compulsory "capstone" course for Advanced Diploma programme. If students with some strong reasons want to excuse from taking PRINCH must forward written justification to the Division Head, and in replacement, to take 3 more electives to fulfill the graduation requirement. The former course code for intermediate level and advanced level Putonghua PRINCH was CPTH3363 and CPTH4713 respectively. # Admission Requirement

1. Current local and overseas undergraduates and postgraduates who wish to apply for July and August intensive programmes should forward application to the Office of Summer Programmes (OSP), where you can receive concession on student facilities and get transcript directly issued by CUHK. More information at: [www.cuhk.edu.hk/osp](http://www.cuhk.edu.hk/osp).
2. For other status and programmes, application can be forwarded to the Chinese Language Center (CLC). The following admission requirement is applicable to CLC direct applicants.
  - Applicants should be, upon enrolment, 16 years old or above. Written consent from parents or guardians is required for applicants below 18. Accommodation is only provided to applicants whose age is 18 or above.
  - Those who apply for award-bearing programme should at least attained minimum Hong Kong secondary five or equivalent educational level upon admission.
  - It is desirable for applicants to possess functional ability in English to ease learning and living in Hong Kong. However, it is NOT an entry pre-requisite. The Center has other language support such as Japanese and Korean.
  - Non-Hong Kong resident or non-working visa holder is required by law to apply for student visa in all study programmes. The Center can sponsor student visa to those in need provided that applicants has enrolled into a full-time study (at least 12 sessions/ week) with the Center.
  - Non-beginners who are applying for non-beginner courses have to fulfill the placement requirement, which is usually conducted online at [www.cuhk.edu.hk/clc/placement.htm](http://www.cuhk.edu.hk/clc/placement.htm).

## Application procedures (CLC direct applicants only)

- Applications can be made any time in a year. For those who are not having HKID or valid working visa, application should be forwarded to the Center **preferably two months prior to the beginning of the intended programme** to provide sufficient time for student visa processing.
- **Immigration requirement:** students who come to study in HK MUST BE either a resident of Hong Kong, working visa and/ or student visa holder. Holder of tourist visa and/or visa exemption status is not allowed to study in any institution in Hong Kong. So, you must be clear about your visa status and apply for visa prior to your study. Otherwise, both you and the center will be liable for violating the immigration law. Under HKSAR immigration policy, holders of student visas should not take employment, paid or unpaid. Thus, students who intend to work must obtain a work visa with the sponsorship of their employer and then make arrangements for studying at the Center. Applicants without a legitimate immigration status for study purpose will not be allowed to attend a class even if they are already in the school and have paid the fee.
- Tourists who enter into Hong Kong with visa exemption status or tourist visa and want to apply for a CLC course MUST change status from tourist to student in person with the immigration office and this process normally takes one month. To avoid frustration and possible delay in visa processing, students are advised to forward application to CLC as early as possible.
- For those who are eligible for student visa sponsorship, there is no need for you to visit China embassy in your home country.

1. Application form;
2. Completed student visa application forms - ID 995A (overseas students only);
3. Proof of financial standing (overseas students only);
4. Copies of current or previous school documents; (compulsory to award-bearing programmes and some cases in student visa application);

2. School deposit (refundable)

It is a tool for communication, a name card for your personality and a bridge leading to a new world.

## Putonghua 普通話 (Standard Chinese)

### **The official language of the People's Republic of China**

Also known as Standard Chinese or Mandarin, Putonghua is the official language of China, Taiwan and one of the four official languages of Singapore. Spoken by more than 1 billion native speakers, Putonghua is increasingly regarded as the language with equal importance to English. Along with China's economic rise, learning Putonghua seems to have become inevitable for many, and the education systems in various countries have made Putonghua as a foreign language programme compulsory for students.

## Cantonese 廣東話

### **A language with a long history and the mother tongue of most Hong Kong people**

Widely spoken in Hong Kong, Macau, Guangdong Province and overseas Chinese communities, Cantonese is one of the seven major dialects of China. Its origin dates from as early as the Qin Dynasty (221 to 206 BC). During the Song Dynasty (960 to 1279 AD), the occupation of northern China by foreign invaders caused an exodus of the Han Chinese to southern China, where the Cantonese dialect took shape. Hong Kong is the only place in the world where people use it officially to discuss serious issues. Its long heritage and vitality give it far-reaching influence on pop culture within the Asia-Pacific region.

## Chinese Characters 中國漢字

### **Representation of China's civilization and culture**

Chinese Characters are logograms used in the writing of Chinese and constitute the oldest continuously-used system of writing in the world. These artistic characters are indispensable to the civilization of China and have great impact on the language systems in the Asia-Pacific region like Japan and Korea. Studies carried out in China have shown that functional literacy requires knowledge of between 3000 to 4000 characters.

## 雅禮中國語文研習所 Yale-China Chinese Language Centre



Founded in 1963 under the joint auspices of New Asia College and the Yale-China Association, the New Asia—Yale-in-China Chinese Language Center (CLC) became part of the Chinese University of Hong Kong (CUHK) in 1974 and has been responsible for the Chinese language education of CUHK students (both local and international) ever since. In 2009, CLC became part of the Faculty of Arts under the new name "Yale-China Chinese Language Centre".

Apart from programmes offered to CUHK students, these programmes have been restructured into 14 Certificate, Diploma and Advanced Diploma programmes intended for the general public to study at the CUHK Shatin campus and Tsim Sha Tsui learning centre. Hong Kong (HK) is a region on China's south-east coast that came under British control in the 19th century. Over 150 years later in 1997 Britain finally handed HK back to China, classifying it as a "Special Administrative Region" (SAR).

HK has made its reputation as a financial centre and Asia's World City. In recent years its economy has become more integrated with that of the mainland.

One of the most striking characteristics of HK is the interweaving of contradictions and the interplay of the exotic and technically advanced. Due to these dazzling contrasts, HK offers visitors something unique – the chance to experience a vibrant Chinese city without sacrificing the comforts of home.

English is widely spoken in this most cosmopolitan of cities. Along with invigorating opportunities for personal growth, Hong Kong offers unmatched insights into fast track global business, rapid urban and social development, and an energetic civil society.

Medical care in Hong Kong is world class and public hospitals are inexpensive.

Law and order in Hong Kong is the envy of many other cities in the world; the crime rate is low and public security is not only very good but also unobtrusive.

### Objectives:

1) to provide all rounded Putonghua teaching to foreigners and non-native speakers of Chinese including: vocabulary, grammar, speaking, listening, reading and writing with special emphasis on speaking skills; 2) to improve their ability to communicate in Chinese with common topics about daily life and work; 3) to help them to internalize basic knowledge of Cantonese/ Putonghua sounds, grammar and vocabulary through interaction between teachers and learners; 4) to provide fluency in communicating with correct and appropriate Cantonese/ Putonghua through speaking practices.

### Learning Outcome for Advanced Diploma Programmes:

To be able to participate actively in conversations on various topics in some formal and most informal settings; handle a wide variety of speaking tasks with communicative strategies; deal effectively with unanticipated complications in oral communication; ability to satisfy requirements of school and work situations.
